EDITORIAL

“2016 Parade Is Now History”

After all, it's a parade. Its purpose is time-honored, time and court tested, and it has meaning. The enjoyment of the many, need not be spoiled by the few.

Immature behavior was on sporadic display, but as a percentage of the throng of hundreds of thousands of visitors, it was much more manageable. According to a police spokesman, “By and large, the parade was peaceful, and those attending were well-behaved, courteous, and orderly.” Reports show that police issued

294 citations for public drinking and arrested five people for charges that included disorderly conduct and assault and battery. Last year, with 1/3 the visitors and snowstorm aftermath, police made 10 arrests and issued 278 citations, primarily for public drinking violations.

The Allied War Veterans Council survived yet another incursion in the form of a route shortening. Its suggestion embraced a public safety and budget tightening rationale that was quickly reacted to and beaten back, although forced

by a court action. As noted the police were out in force and public nuisance was the only significant price paid by the residents. For that matter, the cost of police presence was more than paid for by the City's share of sales and meals taxes generated by the countless visitors and residents spending money over the weekend.

In the end, all went well. The politicians embraced their Mayor and Southie forgave him. Public safety and parade management proved that it was a success. After all, it's a parade.



Evacuation Day

As impressive as the presence of political leaders, South Boston High School's ROTC color guard, Minuteman re-enactors and the straight-backed Marine playing taps, nothing compares to the image of weathered veterans and bright-eyed grammar school students standing with South Bostonians honoring history.

On Thursday March 17, as the Minutemen fired three shots into the air at Dorchester Heights, the tribute began on the 240th anniversary of Evacuation Day. The holiday, officially observed in Suffolk County, commemorates the withdrawal of British forces from Boston on March 17, 1776, in the early stages of the Revolutionary War. American troops had brought cannons from Fort Ticonderoga in New York to fortify Dorchester Heights, eventually causing the British to retreat.

The commemoration featured Mayor Martin J. Walsh, who stated in his remarks, "There's no doubt that Bostonians 240 years ago had differences of opinions, whether it was politics or parade routes," in a

reference to the attempt to shorten the St. Patrick's Day Parade. "They didn't let their differences get in the way of them working together. Those brave men and women stood on this hill in solidarity to protect our city from harm and make the future brighter."

South Boston Citizens Association President Thomas McGrath, opened the ceremonies by thanking all of the volunteers who helped make the nearly month long efforts by the community to keep the spirit of this holiday alive. Representative Nick Collins, whose involvement in this event pre-dates his election, stated that it is important that our children understand the significance of this memorial. He went on to thank Mayor Walsh for his steadfast support of the observance of Evacuation Day for the many years he was the State Representative from Dorchester as the holiday was assaulted as an unnecessary day off.

Senator Linda Dorcea Forry, Councilors Bill Linehan and Michael Flaherty were joined by Fitzgerald Post Commander Bill Desmond and Superintendent of the National Parks of Boston, Michael






Creasey, who stated “Nothing compares to being here on the Heights yourself. To see these views of the city and of Boston Harbor makes you realize what an incredible feat it was for the colonists who fortified this hill.”

In a tradition started by Rep. Collins, Representative Gloria Fox of Roxbury and South Boston Historical Society president Bob Allison in 2011, the entourage completed their ceremonies over on Fort Hill in Roxbury, the site of the further defense of Boston from the British. It was followed by a collation at the historic Shirley Eustis House.

kids in the huge crowd.


This year’s parade, as it is every year, was sponsored by the hard working, patriotic members of the South Boston Allied War Veterans Council and as always, they put a strong emphasis on saluting America’s military and our veterans. It was also dedicated to the memory of the late John J ‘Wacko’ Hurley; a true son of Southie and a legend who was one of this neighborhood’s strongest defenders. The banner carried in Wacko’s memory

by the members of the Jr. ROTC said it all. It read: “In Memory of John J ‘Wacko’ Hurley. 50 Years of Dedication to this Community” Amen to that!

The military presence in the procession loomed large, as marching units from all branches of America’s armed forces proudly marched to the cheers of the throngs that lined the nearly 3-mile parade route. Throughout the line of march, the hymns of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force and Coast Guard were being

played, delighting spectators of all ages. The crew of the Navy ship the ‘USS McFaul’, which was docked in Boston for the celebration, received a rousing welcome as thunderous chants of “USA”, “USA” from thousands of fist-pumping celebrants were heard from the parade’s start to finish. A sea of American and Irish flags waved along the route, as American and Irish pride were definitely the theme of the day.

Always a big hit during the annual parade were the many bagpipe



marching bands that were evenly deployed within the line of march. Other favorites were, of course, the massive but beautiful horses, Clydesdales among them, as well as the mounted police units. Big hits with the crowd every year are the Imperial Storm Troopers led by the evil Darth Vader from the Star Wars movies and the Ghost Busters characters that followed close behind. Colorful and very talented marching high school bands from all across New England and beyond

entertained with their renditions of traditional favorite songs. The Bishop Guertin High School Band, down from Nashua, New Hampshire, made the trek to South Boston once again this year and enjoyed themselves immensely.

And then there were the floats – lots and lots of floats. Floats carrying members of the area's various labor unions, floats advertising local businesses, neighborhood groups and churches and floats with live music being played to add to the Mardi

Gras like atmosphere of the weekend. And to be sure, each and every float was decorated beautifully as the pride and great care in putting them together was evident. And who could forget the BOOM coming from the muskets of the Colonial Militia units that are always so well received. No matter how prepared you think you are as they are about to fire a volley, the ground shaking blasts still stun and then followed by wild applause as the smell of gun powder fills the air. These Colonial Minutemen serve

to remind parade goers that one of the first encounters of America's War of Independence took place right here in Boston at Dorchester Heights.

And so it went for nearly 3 full hours as the more than 100 marching units, once again, kept tradition alive by proudly parading through the streets of South Boston; a community decorated in Red, White and Blue and of course Green for a special time of celebration.





The Castle Island Association started the tradition back in 1980 and has been organizing this event ever since. From the first year, with the Mass being said by Father Kelleher of Don Bosco, who was followed by Father Fleming of St Brigid, this moving ceremony draws at times thousands of people who get up before dawn on Easter Morning and make the trek to 'The Island' by car, bicycle, on foot or by shuttle to experience one of the most unique religious gatherings around. The Sunrise Mass continues to gain in popularity with each passing year and if weather cooperates, draws large crowds each time.

Over the years, people have come in from many surrounding communities and other states to be part of this sacred event to celebrate the Holiest of times on the Christian Calendar. As all know, Easter celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus Christ 3 days after he was taken down from the cross and was buried.

Here, the traditional Catholic Mass will be celebrated and all people of every faith are welcome to be part of it. Holy Communion will be given to

those who wish to receive. A portable altar will be set up from which the Mass will be said. The Service lasts approximately one hour from the time it commences.

Many attendees bring along their own chairs, as there is very little seating on that side of the island. It's also recommended that you check the weather forecast for Sunday morning, so you can dress for whatever nature brings. Because it is such an early time of day and Easter comes early in the season this year, sweaters or jackets, or both, are advised.

Even if you attend your regular Mass or Service at your traditional Church on Easter Sunday in addition to the Sunrise Mass, it is said that attending the Sunrise Mass at Castle Island is very special indeed and often adds to the spirit of this wonderful season.
