#### Residents Show People Power At Edison Plant Meeting

I f there was one sentence that encapsulated the sentiment of residents at Monday night's meeting on the Edison plant development proposal, it came from long time City Point resident and Impact Advisory Board member Joe Lee. The former Boston Public School principal, whose family name dons the playground across from the Edi-

son Plant site, was clear and succinct: "the height and density of the buildings you are proposing here for this project - No way."

John O'Toole gave his neighbors from City Point good advice, "Tell your family, friends and neighbors to pay attention to what's going on here on First Street. It's important." He wasn't alone. But, it wasn't just about City Point. Over 150 residents from Andrew Square to Telegraph Hill to City Point wanted to know what kind of a real estate development project was going to 'privatize' a huge swath of the harbor waterfront resource in South Boston.

Just as the BPDA representa-



tive Tim Czerwienski was about to orchestrate his agency's tactic of break-out sessions to disperse the energy in the room, Representative Nick Collins set the tone and direction of the meeting calling for Ralph Cox, one of the development partners, to provide all in attendance with a re-cap of their proposal.

Jane DuWors, a confidante of the late Councilor Jim Kelly, came out of activist retirement to lend her sharp memory, crisp grasp of the facts and biting wit to call the developers out on their characterization of their public information obligation. She credited South Boston Today's front-page coverage of this project with alerting her to the meeting. She and several others pointed out that the need for affordable housing begs for an increase of the 13% base requirement. "It's not just about City Point, it's the whole community that is impacted", she stated.

Until now, many residents had been lulled into a sense of finality as to the status of the plans. The public community meetings are required to be advertised through a news outlet like the Boston Herald and local newspapers like South Boston Today. The BPDA on its website gives notice on meetings of the Impact Advisory Group (IAG). These meetings have more impact, because there is a presumption that the Group speaks for the neighborhood.

While members of the Group are well intentioned, in the case of Edison, the proposed project itself is so "enormous", as Forbes Magazine recently described it, and the stakes are so high for all parties, that a handful of well-meaning residents can be and, at times in the past, have been co-opted by smoothtalking developers and complicit bureaucrats. Evidence is beginning to present itself that the interests of the local arts constituency and the promotion of high-end social and recreational amenities, like daycare on the waterfront, are being played against the commerce interests of the shipping industry and waterfront jobs, as well as neighborhood public access and traffic impacts.

The base issues with the Edison Plant proposal are simple, chronic and straightforward. Unchecked development of South Boston outstrips other sections of Boston. Not enough affordable housing is being offered. The density and potential traffic impact is huge. The fate of Conley Terminal and that of seaport related jobs are in question. Open and green space is dwindling.

A long overdue clean-up of the deep seeded toxins of such a fossil-fuel based power generator is crucial, but at what price to a vibrant neighborhood of welcoming residents with wonderful resources all around it. Public amenities and benefits such as an arts gallery and attendant social and recreational venues are really not site specific when it comes to proximity of location. It could be located in other spaces within the community, if there is such a need and support for these amenities.

Gail Moran of City Point and George McEvoy, business agent of the Longshoreman (ILA Local 799), along with over a dozen of their fellow members, made the case for the effect traffic congestion would have on the travel time of containerized tractor trailers in and out of Conley Terminal, as compared to other competing ports. His questions came in the context of his organization's hard-fought lobbying efforts alongside of MassPort and local elected officials Congressman Stephen F. Lynch, Senator Linda Dorcena-Forry and Representative Collins to combine federal and state funds to the tune of over \$1B to dredge Boston Harbor and modernized the container facility.

The next meeting of the IAG is scheduled for Monday July 31 beginning with a tour of the Edison Plant 776 Summer Street followed by a 7PM meeting at the South Boston Branch Library at 646 East Broadway. As noted on the BPDA site, the purpose of this meeting is different than that of a traditional community meeting. As part of the development review process, Impact Advisory Group (IAG) members work closely with BPDA staff to identify the impacts of a project and recommend appropriate community benefits to offset those impacts. IAG meetings prioritize discussion between the developer and IAG members. If residents wish to make formal comments, email Tim.Czerwienski@Boston.gov

As Mr. O'Toole stated, this project, and its lasting impact for generations, demands the attention of South Boston residents. Taking the time to pay attention is sound advice.

### The Wine Guy Got BBQ? Get these

him cook dinner on our grille. He'd make it really hot, put some meat down and sear it on both sides for about two minutes per side. He called it," Pittsburgh style"; done on the outside, red on the inside...and I mean RED. At our house, it was the only way you got your meat done, sort of like Henry Ford's early model Fords: you could have any color you wanted, as long as it was black.

Today, grilling is an art form, there are cable channels devoted exclusively to it and the inventory of ingredients and tools in mind-numbing. Consider this column a, "no-numb" zone.

I'd like to make a few suggestions that will enhance your food, make the whole BBQ thing better and not cripple your bank account. The list is relatively short, as the trend is fairly new. It's a trend, however, that I think will evolve and expand. Try the following in your wine glass AND on your food.

• 1000 Stories Bourbon Barrel-Aged Zinfandel, 2015, California, (\$15.99) This Zin has lots of juice from Mendocino County and the barrels

hen I was a kid, I'd stand out with it's aged in were originally used for smallmy dad in the backyard and watch batch bourbon aging. Notes of dry herbs and vanilla combine with dark berries and a salty caramel finish. While this is a big wine with a nice finish, the barrel aging in bourbon creates a smoother mouthfeel that typical Zins. Ribs, Brisket and Pulled Pork will all be nicely enhanced with this one.

- Robert Mondavi Private Selection Bourbon Barrels Cabernet Sauvignon, 2015, California, (\$12.99) The Mondavi brands, especially the Woodbridge line, are viewed as the everyman's wine-good, consistent wine. This Cabernet, however, will pleasantly surprise you with its rich, ripe nose and noticeable bourbon notes. It's smooth, almost creamy with almond and butterscotch flavors on the finish. I'd try this one with some Black Angus sirloin tips, smoked Goudainfused baked potatoes (also cooked on the grille) and sautéed mushrooms (recipe below).
- Cooper and Thief, Bourbon Barrel-aged Red Blend, 2014, California, (\$28.99) Even without the bourbon barrel aging, this would be a "monster", but the barrel aging combines the varietals involved with a supple texture



that you won't forget! Big nose of earthy, herbal tones with mocha, caramel and blackberries bursting around the mouth and a smooth, lingering finish. Like a good, small-batch bourbon, this is also a sipper. 17% alcohol, so go slow! SAUTEED MUSHROOMS- (Serves 4) Ingredients:

- 2 packages of Baby Bella mushrooms, (freshest at Foodie's)

- Steak Sauce; Maple Syrup; Butter; Soy sauce and ANY of the wines listed above.
- DIRECTIONS:
- o In a frying pan, add both packages of mushrooms after washing
- o Add ¼ stick of butter
- o Cook on medium/low heat until butter has been absorbed
- o Add ¼ cup of any of the wines listed above
- o Add 2 tablespoons of steak sauce
- o Add 1 tablespoon of maple syrup
- o Add 1 tablespoon of soy sauce
- o Cover and cook for 10 minutes over medium heat
- o Remove from heat, keep cover on until ready to serve

These are good on the side or on top of the pulled pork, brisket and tips. So, get out there and Grill and Swill!

#### Excel High School Teachers Go To Summer School

# Sharpen Advanced Placement Teaching Skills

everal teachers from Excel High School are attending a special kind of summer school: intensive training to prepare to teach Advanced Placement® (AP) courses. The teacher training session is part of Mass Insight Education's (MIE) AP STEM and English initiative, a program to expand college-level coursework opportunities for high school students.

More than five hundred school teachers from Massachusetts, Rhode Island and Louisiana will attend the Advanced Placement Summer Institute (APSI) during the weeks of July 24 and July 31 at Bridgewater State University, where they will focus on pre-AP and AP coursework in their fields. Advanced Placement courses offer college classes to high school students to prepare them for college success while also providing the opportunity to earn college credits before graduating high school.

The following Excel High School teachers will attend the training: Michelle Caine, Pre-AP Biology Jennifer Garay, AP Calculus AB Felicia Jordan, AP English Language & Composition

Ivyrose Likis, AP Biology

The teacher training is supported by MIE as part of its mission to increase the number of rigorous, college-level high school AP courses and help close the achievement gap. Annually, MIE's AP STEM and English program reaches more than 10,000 students at over 70 partner schools across the Commonwealth.

The Summer Institute is endorsed by the College Board and co-sponsored by Eastern Bank.

"We are proud to offer this unique

training program to teachers with our partners at Bridgewater State University, the College Board, and Eastern Bank," said Dr. Susan Lusi, MIE's president and CEO. "The dedication of teachers attending APSI is inspirational and is reflected in their classroom results."

The MIE program has a long track record of working with partner high schools in expanding college opportunity for high school students. Of the 23,000 students who participated in MIE's AP STEM program and graduated from high school since the 2008-2009 school year, 78 percent have gone on to attend college – 90 percent of those students have persisted through two years of college, and 81 percent have either graduated from college or are on track to graduate. The numbers are similar for students of color - 88 percent have persisted through two years of college, and 78 percent have either graduated from college or are on track to graduate. #### No New Incidents of Vandalism A Follow-up to Last Week's Reports

arried in last week's South Boston Today was a report about the rash of vandalism that was taking place in many locations around South Boston. Obscene graffiti sprayed on the walls of both private and public buildings, playground equipment destroyed, smashed glass everywhere. Gang symbols were left in several locations and so much more caused furious residents to call this newspaper, as well as city officials, and demand something be done. Some residents had even offered to take matters into their own hands and deal directly with the culprits, if nothing was done by officials.

This week, we are happy to report that things seem to have taken a positive turn. As of this writing and as far as we know, there have been no new incidents of vandalism. In fact, it's been reported that some local teens had stepped up and volunteered to help clean up the messes left by what is believed was caused by other teens. Mike Dowling, in Face Book posts, stated that he was encouraged that so many teens had come forward and offered to work to repair damage, which they did and that in the days following the reported stories, no new incidents occurred.

As was stated in last week's report, there was no excuse for what had been taking place. South Boston is a community that does all it can to provide educational and recreation opportunities and facilities to people of all age groups and interests and that includes our teens. To quote one saddened resident dismayed by the destruction "This neighborhood is

better than that and that includes our teenagers, at least most of them." She's right, we are better than that and the fact that local young people came forward to help repair the damage caused is encouraging and they should be commended and praised for their civic mindedness and pride in their neighborhood.


SBT spoke with police officers regarding what happened and they said they will continue to monitor and deal with the situation and will be ready should it arise again and that the names of the suspects are known. Neighbors have said that they too will be vigilant in watching closely for any sign of vandalism in the future.

But the hope expressed by many is that the worst is over and all who had been involved have come to their senses and realized that this is their town and that they too should take pride in it and do their part to make it better, not bring it down.


all participating in the spirit of the evening. Norman Crump presented a Crump-esque quality painting of the Tot Lot to Lori's Family.


### South Boston Author Conor Jennings Earns 5-Star Reviews

ot to take anything away from the Major League Baseball season, but NFL training camps have begun. By the time you read this, the New England Patriots will have started their training camp. Which means Tom Brady vs Jimmy Garoppolo will once again be under the microscope to those who are looking for some type of quarterback controversy that doesn't actually exist. But now, more than ever, people will try to dissect the number of reps Garoppolo takes with the starters and compare it to the number of reps Brady takes. They will then overreact and create some type of quarterback controversy, claiming that Bill Belichick is seemingly, and privately, ready to move on from Brady and give Garoppolo the keys to the car. By now, everyone has expressed their opinion on the David Price vs Dennis Eckerslev confrontation on the Boston Red Sox' plane last month. The reason we're still talking about it is because Dan Shaughnessy wrote a column last weekend that detailed the confrontation, but also shed some light onto a pretty dirty move that Jackie Bradley Jr. pulled on Eckersley back in 2015. But the worst part of the column was how the rest of the team was portrayed. Sources told Shaughnessy that Red Sox players applauded Price after he confronted Eckersley. As if they all have it so bad. Eckersley is one of the best color commentators in the business because he tells it like it is. It's authentic, and that's why it's great. But these current group of Red Sox are making it sound like Eckersley is constantly crushing people on the team. And that's certainly not true. The simple solution would be to trade Bradley Jr. Perhaps you package him with Price, eat half of Price's salary, add a few prospects, and get the Pirates to also give you righty starter Gerrit Cole. Maybe you could even steal Josh Harrison. That's the type of blockbuster trade that I would be looking to make right now, if I were the Red Sox. It's probably not going to happen, but I feel it makes sense for both teams. And if somehow the Sox and Pirates do make a trade, let it be known, for the record, that they took my advice.
